English	Maths	Science
<p>This half term Maple class are following the 'Talk for Write' English scheme of work. This runs on a 3-week timetable.</p> <p>We will be covering:</p> <p>The Highway Rat Author: Julia Donaldson</p> <p>We will be covering how to creative our own narrative. This will encourage oracy for the children and enable them to retell known stories as well as create their own.</p> <p>Grammar: Grammar will link to the genres of writing being studied. This includes sentence types, adjectives, nouns, verbs, and conjunctions.</p> <p>Punctuation: Capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, question marks, exclamation marks and commas.</p> <p>Spelling: Children will learn to use their phonics knowledge to spell new words and they will be working on spelling the Year 2 and 3 common exception words.</p>	<p>Areas being covered this half term;</p> <p>Core work will be from White Rose Maths supplemented with additional materials as required to meet pupil's needs.</p> <p>Measures</p> <p>Geometry</p> <p>Fractions</p> <p>Key Vocabulary: Measure, weigh, mass, gram, kilogram, heavier, lighter, scale, volume, capacity, litre, millilitres, centilitres, coordinates, axis, vertical, horizontal, numerator, denominator, fraction, half, quarter</p> 	<p>Topic: Scientific Investigations</p> <p>This half term we will be carrying out different experiments linked to our previous science topics. <p>History- Crime and Punishment</p> <p>In this unit, children will learn about crime and punishment throughout history. This will include methods of punishment used by the Romans, Tudors and Victorians. We will also be looking at modern methods of crime prevention.</p> <p>Key Vocab - Crime Punishment Court Judge Prison Guilty Innocent</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p>At Bramley Oak, we follow Read, Write Inc for our teaching of phonics. Accelerated Reader is used to support and challenge children when they complete their phonics programme.</p> <p>This half term, the children will be taught either set 1, set 2 or set 3 sounds, as well as common exception words (red words) to support their writing.</p> <p>Children will take home a familiar phonics book in their book bag. Once their sheet has been signed 10 times, they will win a prize! Each time a child brings in their book bag, they will have a raffle ticket entered into a prize draw.
