Grammar:

We will be developing our fluency of key facts such as recognising, finding and naming a half, quarter, and a third. We will be using concrete and pictorial resources so support us to find a half, quarter, and third of different amounts.

Number and Place Value

We will also be revisiting number and place value to consolidate our understanding of the place value of each digit in 3 digit numbers and compare and order some numbers up to 4 digits. We will read and write numbers in words and solve number problems and practical problems involving these ideas.
