In this unit, children will learn about what life was like in the Stone Age. Children will explore how hunter-gatherers survived and will compare the lives of hunter-gatherers to the way people lived at the end of the Stone Age in permanent settlements. The children will also look at how tools were used in the Stone Age and how they improved lives. Key Vocab - Hunter-gatherer Settlement Migration Technology Prehistoric	At Bramley Oak, we follow Read, Write Inc for our teaching of phonics. Accelerated Reader is used to support and challenge children when they complete their phonics programme. This half term, the children will be taught either set 1, set 2 or set 3 sounds, as well as common exception words (red words) to support their writing. Children will take home a familiar phonics book in their book bag. Once their sheet has been signed 10 times, they will win a prize! Each time a child brings in their book bag, they will have a raffle ticket entered into a prize draw. This will be announced in assembly every Friday.	Our class book this half term Elder class will be reading a range of picture books during their story time, with additional opportunities throughout the school day to support their speaking and listening skills. Books will be chosen carefully with reference to representing a range of people, beliefs and celebrating difference and diversity. As well as this, we will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction to support our English topic 'La Luna'. A focus will be to read a range of books that support social and emotional regulation and offer fantastic teaching points and opportunities in a creative and child-centred way.
