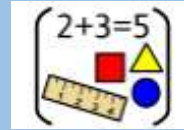
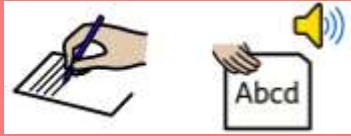

English	Maths	Science
<p>This half term Maple class are following the 'Talk for Write' English scheme of work. This runs on a 3-week timetable.</p> <p>We will be covering:</p> <p>The Magic Porridge Pot</p> <p>We will be covering how to create our own narrative, focusing on setting description. This will encourage oracy for the children and enable them to retell known stories as well as create their own.</p> <p>The Tree Giant</p> <p>We will be using The Tree Giant to inspire our own non-chronological reports about giants.</p> <p>Grammar:</p> <p>Grammar will link to the genres of writing being studied. This includes sentence types, adjectives, nouns, verbs, and conjunctions.</p> <p>Punctuation:</p> <p>Capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, question marks, exclamation marks and commas.</p> <p>Spelling:</p>	<p>Core work will be from White Rose Maths supplemented with additional materials as required to meet pupil's needs.</p> <p>Areas being covered this half term;</p> <p>Fractions</p> <p>We will be developing our fluency of key facts such as recognising, finding and naming a half, quarter, and a third. We will be using concrete and pictorial resources so support us to find a half, quarter, and third of different amounts.</p> <p>Key Vocabulary: equal, part, numerator, denominator, group, share, divide, half, quarter, third</p> <p>Number and Place Value</p> <p>We will also be revisiting number and place value to consolidate our understanding of the place value of each digit in 3 digit numbers and compare and order numbers up to 4 digits. We will read and write numbers in words and solve number problems and practical problems involving these ideas.</p> <p>Key Vocabulary: digit, hundreds, tens, ones, less than, greater than, equal to, order</p>	<p>Topic- States of Matter</p> <p>In this topic students will learn about types of solids, liquids and gases, how temperature and pressure affect substances in different states and how matter changes state.</p> <p>We will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To group or sort materials into solids, liquids and gases To observe that some materials change state when heated or cooled To understand and use the terms evaporation and condensation To describe solids, liquids and gases <p>Key Vocabulary: matter, solid, liquid, gas, melt, freeze, condense, solidify, dissolve, separate</p> <div data-bbox="1756 1007 2011 1203" data-label="Image"> </div>

Children will learn to use their phonics knowledge to spell new words and they will be working on spelling the Year 2 and 3 common exception words.



PSHE	Cooking	PE
<p>We are using the story project to help students connect emotionally and cognitively with different PSHE themes.</p> <p>One of the key books we will be focusing on is The Boy Who Grew Flowers by Jen Wojtowicz</p> <p>Objectives Covered:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. I can tell you how friends should treat each other. 2. I can politely say 'no' when I don't want to do something. 3. I can explain that friendships have ups and downs. 	<p>We will be visiting the cooking room once a fortnight to take part in a cooking session.</p> <p>We will be focusing on a range of different skills knife skills and practicing these in our recipes.</p> <p>Some of the recipes we will be using this half term include 4-Way Wraps, Salmon Poke Bowl, and Rocky Roads!</p> <p>We will sample our food at the end of the session and work together to clean and tidy the kitchen independently.</p>	<p>In PE we will be practising our send and return skills with a focus on tennis. Students will be supported to develop their hand-eye coordination and striking skills. Students will also continue to develop their team skills.</p> <p>Key vocabulary:</p> <p>Movement, positional play, throwing, rolling, hand eye-coordination, striking objects with different rackets.</p>

<p>History- The Bronze Age and Iron Age</p> <p>In this unit, we will be learning about the period of time between the Bronze Age and Iron age in Britain and evaluate some of the major changes during this time. Students will explore how lifestyles evolved, looking at the factors that led to hunter-gatherers settling into early farming communities and how these settlements developed.</p> <p>Key vocabulary: archaeologists, artefact, Neolithic, B.C., chronology, hunter-gatherers, shelter, civilization, settlement, prey</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p>At Bramley Oak, we follow Read, Write Inc for our teaching of phonics.</p> <p>Accelerated Reader is used to support and challenge children when they complete their phonics programme.</p> <p>This half term, the children will be taught either set 1, set 2 or set 3 sounds, as well as common exception words (red words) to support their writing.</p> <p>Children will take home a familiar phonics book in their book bag. Once their sheet has been signed 10 times, they will win a prize!</p>	<p>Our class book this half term</p> <p>A variety of picture books to aid English scheme and increase listening and attention skills.</p>
