Talk for Writing is an engaging teaching approach that helps students develop their writing skills through a structured process. It involves three main stages: imitation, innovation, and independent application.  Imitation: Students learn and internalise a model text by reading, listening, and story mapping. This helps them become familiar with the structure, vocabulary, and key features of
