English	Maths	Science
<p>This half term Rowan class are following the 'Talk for Write' English scheme of work. This runs on a 3-week timetable.</p> <p><u>We will be covering:</u></p> <p>Supertato Grow Your Own</p> <p>We will be covering how to create our own narrative. This will encourage oracy for the children and enable them to retell known stories as well as create their own.</p> <p>We will then focus on non-fiction texts to ask questions and research a topic. We will use this information to write a persuasive argument.</p> <p><u>Grammar:</u></p> <p>Grammar will link to the genres of writing being studied. This includes sentence types, adjectives, nouns, verbs, and conjunctions.</p> <p><u>Punctuation:</u></p> <p>Capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, question marks, exclamation marks and commas.</p>	<p>Areas being covered this half term:</p>  <p>Fractions, Decimals and Percentage Number & Place Value</p> <p>Core work will be from White Rose Maths supplemented with additional materials as required to meet pupil's needs.</p> <p><u>Key Vocabulary:</u></p> <p>Fraction, part, whole, equal, share, half, quarter, third, equivalent, numerator, denominator, hundreds, tens, ones, zero, place value, greater than, less than, order, partition, digit.</p>	<p>Squash, Bend, Twist & Stretch</p> <p>This topic covers the following learning: Finding out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.</p> <p>In this topic, children explore how the shapes of objects can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. In doing this they realise questions, perform simple tests and gather and record data.</p> <p><u>Key Vocabulary:</u></p> <p>Squash / bend / twist / stretch / squeeze / pull / push / force / material / elastic</p>

Spelling:

Children will learn to use their phonics knowledge to spell new words and they will be working on spelling the Year 2 and 3 common exception words.

PSHE

We are using the story project to help students connect emotionally and cognitively with different PSHE themes through engaging narratives and discussions.

One of the key books we will be focusing on is **Chicken Clicking by Tony Ross**

Computing

This half term we will be looking at **Digital Photography.**



In this unit children will:

- Learn to recognise that different devices can be used to capture photographs and will gain experience capturing, editing, and improving photos.
- Use this knowledge to recognise that images they see may not be real.
